1315 - Upon completing the financial report, Treasurer Greg Browning returned the floor to President Clemons. President Clemons passed out ballots for the election process in order to fill two (2) vacancies on the AACOP Board. The votes were cast and tallied with the following results:

Chief Kamai and Chief Lucking with the majority of the votes are elected as Board Members of the Alaska Association of Chiefs of Police. Congratulations to both men.

1320 - President Clemons introduced Christine McLeod from the Sitka Women on Domestic Violence – Alaska, and Katie Tepas, State of Alaska, to speak with the membership about Domestic Violence.

1346 – President Clemons introduced Chief Greg Russell (Ret.) with AML/JIA, who spoke about, and answered question regarding the accreditation process currently under consideration by the members.

Both chief Russell and Kevin Smith, Executive Director of AML/JIA spoke briefly about upcoming Law Enforcement Management Institute in February 2005 and accreditation concerns.

1414 - Don White with the State of Alaska D.O.T. introduced himself and spoke to the members about traffic data, the compilation of data, and how the data was utilized.

1418 – Jim Wolfe, retired criminalist (formerly with the State of Alaska Crime Lab) introduced himself and advised the members that he was now with the Traveling Trainer Program, and would be available to instruct evidence classes to officers across the state. Jim advised that he is currently working up a schedule; briefly spoke about the classes he will be giving.

1420 - Asst. Chief Browning, Juneau Police Department spoke about sharing data between agencies, and spoke about Alaska Law Enforcement Information System (ALEISS) and COPLINK computer software. Chief Browning encouraged everyone to learn more about the system through www.aleiss.org, and to check into accessing the compiled data without networking into the system.

Chief Browning also addressed possible membership in the Multi Agency Justice Integration Consortium (M.A.J.I.C.), a group in Anchorage attempting to link information resources with agencies throughout the state. Vote was taken on the motion and second to join the consortium. Vote passed with a majority of the members voting to join. Chief Browning was tasked with researching the membership options. 1430 – Director Paul Harris, Fairbanks Police Department, spoke briefly about the Alaska Police Corps and introduced Scooter Welch, who spoke about the Corps and

passed out resume` packages from two possible candidates currently enrolled in the program, but without agency affiliation.

1435 – Chief Walt Monegan, Anchorage Police Department, spoke with the membership in reference to his E911 difficulties and the attempt to change the current regulations on E911 to \$2.00 per 911 call. Chief Monegan also spoke in reference to unpaid parking tickets enforcement, as well as enforcement of junk vehicles.

1443 – Captain David Hudson, Alaska State Troopers, advised that he is no longer working with the State Drug Enforcement Team, but is currently working on Mongolian Police Training Recruitment.

1445 President Clemons announced the election results with Chief T. C. Kamai and Chief John Lucking being elected to the AACOP Board.

1447 – Chief Chuck Kopp, Kenai Police Department, Addressed the membership in reference to the APOA Crime Conference in Kenai, as well as Iraqi Police Training issues.

1450 – Kevin Smith and Chief Kopp briefly discussed the meetings to be held in Kenai during the APOA Crime Conference.
