Job Posting Summary: The Tanana Valley Campus is located in Fairbanks at the Tanana Valley Campus Center, the Tanana Valley Campus Downtown Center, the

Hutchison Institute of Technology, the University Park Building, Northern Military Programs on Eielson AFB and Ft. Wainwright Army base and the Bunnell House Early Childhood Lab. Tanana Valley Campus offers 40 associate degree and certificate programs that are responsive to local and regional vocational/technical training needs, focusing on areas that are crucial to the workforce needs of the state such as allied health, process technology, information technology, applied business, human services, and many others.

TVC's certificate and degree programs also provide students with the academic framework to help them achieve their higher education goals, whether it is to complete an associate of arts degree or transfer into a baccalaureate program.

In addition, TVC provides career training and development opportunities through workforce development and professional development programs. Staff and faculty have forged close ties with businesses and local agencies, enhancing instruction and increasing job placements.

Duty:

Teach nine to twelve credits or equivalent each semester including student advising.

Coordinate the TVC Law Enforcement program. Coordinate and supervise the conduct of a 13-week police training institute. Responsible for the development, evaluation and updates of the Public Safety AAS curriculum in accordance with UAF academic process and accreditation standards.

Prepare each semester's course schedule; recruit, orient, and evaluate part time faculty; advise students seeking career in Public Safety, coordinate with police departments and other law enforcement agencies on program needs, organize and meet regularly with a program advisory committee. Identify and contract with appropriate adjuncts and program assistants.

Coordinate the ordering, acquisition and maintenance of program equipment. Develop and manage program budget. Report to the TVC director and law enforcement advisory committee and maintain good communication with local and state law enforcement agencies. Perform university, professional and community service.

Work in concert with the Alaska Police Standards Council to keep law enforcement training in compliance with police standards council requirements.
